2. Who is the supplier of the contract? If possible can you also provide me with the name of the vendor, if applicable?	Ideagen Huddle Limited
3. What is the annual contract value for each contract?	£90,000 excluding VAT
4. What type of cloud environment? Private Cloud- a distinct and secure cloud based environment in which only the specified client can operate. Public Cloud - where cloud services are provided in a virtualized environment, constructed using pooled shared physical resources, and accessible over a public network such as the internet. Hybrid- integrated cloud service utilising both private and public clouds to perform distinct functions within the same organisation.	Public Cloud

Annex B

Section 40, Freedom of Information Act 2000 – Personal information

Section 40, paragraphs 1-4, of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) provides that:

- (1) *Any information to which a request for information relates is exempt information if it constitutes personal data of which the applicant is the data subject.*
- (2) *Any information to which a request for information relates is also exempt information if—*
- (a) it constitutes personal data which does not fall within subsection (1), and*
 - (b) the first, second or third condition below is satisfied.*
- (3A) *The first condition is that the disclosure of the information to a member of the public otherwise than under this Act—*
- (a) would contravene any of the data protection principles, or*
 - (b) would do so if the exemptions in section 24(1) of the Data Protection Act 2018 (manual unstructured data held by public authorities) were disregarded.*
- (3B) *The second condition is that the disclosure of the information to a member of the public otherwise than under this Act would contravene Article 21 of the GDPR (general processing: right to object to processing).*
- (4A) *The third condition is that—*
- (a) on a request under Article 15(1) of the GDPR (general processing: right of access by the data subject) for access to personal data, the information would be withheld in reliance on provision made by or under section 15, 16 or 26 of, or Schedule 2, 3 or 4 to, the Data Protection Act 2018, or*
 - (b) on a request under section 45(1)(b) of that Act (law enforcement processing: right of access by the data subject), the information would be withheld in reliance on subsection (4) of that section.*

Reasons why we have applied this exemption.

We are not obliged, under Section 40(2) of the FOIA, to provide the personal information of another person if releasing it would contravene any of the provisions of the Data Protection Act 2018.

We believe disclosing the contact details of individual NAO officers would contravene the first data protection principle, which requires the processing of personal data to be lawful, fair and transparent.

In this instance we do not believe it would be fair to the individual officers concerned to disclose their personal information. We have therefore withheld their contact details on page two of this response.
